
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Treatment

■ "The provision, coordination, or management of health care and related services by one or more providers, including the coordination or management of health care by a provider with a third party; consultation between providers relating to a patient; or the referral of a patient for care from one provider to another."

Treatment

- No patient consent necessary
- Can be current or prospective treatment



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Healthcare Operations

Conducting quality assessment and improvement activities

Developing clinical guidelines

Conducting patient safety activities as defined in applicable regulations

Conducting population-based activities relating to improving health or reducing health care cost

Developing protocols

Conducting case management and care coordination (including care planning)

Contacting health care providers and patients with information about treatment alternatives
