# NEMSIS v3 DEMDataSet Guide

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#### **Overview**

The NEMSIS v3 data standard includes three data sets: DEMDataSet (snapshot information about EMS agencies), EMSDataSet (EMS patient care reports), and StateDataSet (state reporting requirements and resources).

This guide discusses DEMDataSet. The agency demographic (DEM) file describes various aspects of the reporting Emergency Medical Services (EMS) agency. Each agency demographic file provides important information about the agency's composition, resources, and requirements and an overview of the services delivered. The DEM file specifically identifies the organization type, the service area, allowed procedures, medications, and protocols, personnel, vehicles, devices, and other critical information about the agency. The NEMSIS Technical Assistance Center (TAC) highly recommends that the agency DEM files are compiled by the EMS agency as the authoritative source of information and submitted to the state EMS office. The DEMS files are forwarded to the TAC via web services for entry into the NEMSIS national EMS repository.

# **Purpose of DEMDataSet**

The NEMSIS TAC created the DEMDataSet XML Schema (XSD) to provide a consistent format to share NEMSIS v3 data about EMS responses to incidents. Nationally, there is an increased need for EMS data as a valuable asset that can improve the capability to conduct public health surveillance, assist with resource allocation, evaluate innovative payment models, and support evidence-based EMS delivery of patient care systems. The agency DEM files submitted to the national EMS repository are a vital piece of information that allows software systems to delineate the activity of thousands of EMS agencies across the country submitting millions of EMS records each year.

#### **DEMDataSet at the National Level**

Local EMS agencies use field-level "Collect Data" software products to collect the EMS agency demographics (DEM) files and electronic patient care reports (ePCRs). The EMS data are first sent to the state-level EMS repository, then exported to the national-level EMS repository using "Receive and Process" software. The NEMSIS XSD validates the structure of the data prior to entry in the NEMSIS repository. The validation system checks to ensure that the agency DEM file in the NEMSIS repository. If the agency DEM file is missing, incomplete, or incorrect the ePCR data will fail to enter the NEMSIS repository.

# **DEMDataSet Description in the v3.5 Data Dictionary**

The <u>NEMSIS v3.5.0 Data Dictionary</u> is the key source of information related to the agency demographic data elements in the DEMDataSet Grouping and Sections. In the overview description of the NEMSIS Data Dictionary, there is a chart that outlines the composition of DEMDataSet and the elements that should be collected for the National EMS Database, and the data elements that should be considered for use at the state and local levels depending on each state or local EMS system's need.

# **DEMDataSet Sections**

There are ten subsections within the DEMDataset. Each subsection contains information about a different aspect of the EMS agency. The data elements in the DEM subsections are labeled as national, state, or neither. If the data element is labeled as national, it must be collected at the local EMS agency level, submitted to the state, then submitted to the national level at the NEMSIS TAC. If the data element is labeled as state only, it may also be labeled as recommended usage to be collected at the state, but is not required at the national level. If the data element is not labeled as a national or state, it may be labeled as optional usage. If the data element is related to a configuration section, it will be labeled as mandatory usage. In total, there are 152 elements in the DEMDataset section.

Each element has a usage level that indicates when the data element is expected to be collected:

- Mandatory = Must be completed and does not allow for NOT values.
- Required = Must be completed and allows NOT values.
- Recommended = Does not need to be completed and allows NOT values.
- Optional = Does not need to be completed and does not allow for NOT values.

#### **Elements in the DEMDataset Sections**

There is an excel spreadsheet on the NEMSIS website titled v3 Summary of Changes (xlsx). The spreadsheet lists all the v3.5 National and State elements, and was used to create the charts below describing the ten subsections of the DEMDataset. The spreadsheet was filtered on the element numbers, element names, distinction as a national, state, or optional element, and the usage. The only national elements assigned to DEM elements are in the dAgency and dConfiguration sections.

The DEMDataset subsections are detailed below. The sections include:



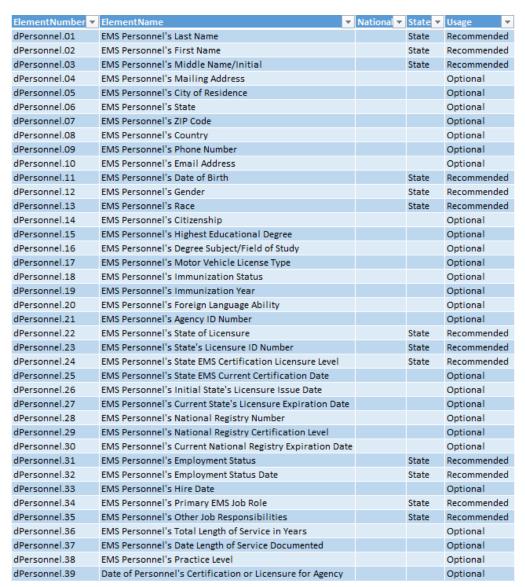

All elements in the dFacility section are designated as optional usage. They are not required for the National EMS Database, but may be considered for use at the state and local levels depending on each state or local EMS system's need.



### 8. Listed below are NEMSIS data elements in the dCustomResults Section.

All elements in the dCustomResults and dCustomConfiguration sections are designated as either mandatory or optional usage. They are mandatory if the state implements custom elements, but not required for the National EMS Database. Custom elements may be considered for use at the state and local levels depending on each state or local EMS system's need.

# **DEMDataSet Completeness and Accuracy**

There are instances when the agency DEM files are missing, incomplete, or incorrect and the ePCR data will fail to enter the NEMSIS repository. Within the v3.5 Data Standard there are 22 National Mandatory and Required elements that must be completed for the agency DEM file.

# Mandatory Elements must have a value.

The NEMSIS Data Dictionary indicates if the information cannot be completed for the **Required Elements**, the element can be left blank. Required Elements allow for the NOT Values (NV) code = 7701003. "If a data element was unintentionally left blank, the EMS software should auto-populate it with "Not Recorded."

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#### **Common Reasons for Submission Failures**

The most common reasons for submission failures are:

- The DEM files fail for one reason: XML schema/Schematron validation error.
- The EMS files fail for two reasons: XML schema/Schematron validation error OR non-matching dAgency.01, dAgency.02, or dAgency.04.

Data submissions from the state will fail at the national level when there are inconsistencies between the DEM and ePCR values of dAgency.01, dAgency.02, and dAgency.04.

Here are two common examples of inconsistencies between DEM and ePCR files that cause failures:

DEM file information:	
dAgency.01 = 018	
dAgency.02 = 018	
dAgency.04 = 24	

ePCR file information:
dAgency.01 = 018
dAgency.02 = 0180
dAgency.04 = 38

DEM file information:
dAgency.01 = 4321
dAgency.02 = 1234
dAgency.04 = 52

ePCR file information:
dAgency.01 = 1234
dAgency.02 = 1234
dAgency.04 = 61

The definitions for the dAgency.01, dAgency.2, and dAgency.04 elements are:

**dAgency.01- EMS Agency Unique State ID:** The unique ID assigned to the EMS Agency is associated with all state licensure numbers and information.

**dAgency.02 – EMS Agency Number:** The state-assigned provider number of the responding agency. Depending on the services provided by an agency, an EMS Agency can have more than one Agency Number within a state. This reflects the ability of an EMS Agency to have a different number for each service type or location (based on state implementation).

dAgency.04 - EMS Agency State: The state/territory which assigned the EMS agency number.

To avoid failure of data submissions to the national repository, DEM and ePCR values for elements dAgency.01, dAgency.02, and dAgency.04 must be consistent.
